You're the fun one. Pouring, mixing, refilling, taking orders. And don't forget to pour a glass for me (just leave it on the counter, I'll find it).



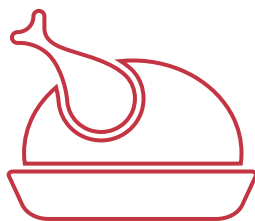
THE HERDER

When plates are empty and stomachs are full, it's your time to shine. And shine you will. That means clearing and loading the dishwasher while I put things back where I like them.



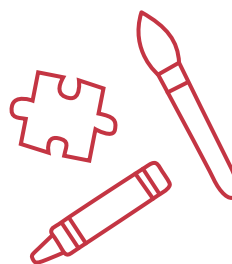
THE RUNNER
